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Motivations

- Medicines comprise **24.9% of total health expenditure** globally
(WHO World Medicines Situation 2011)
 - Aging, Non-Communicable Diseases
 - Expansion of **Universal Health Coverage**
(Access, Affordability, and Quality)
- **Quality** an individual and global concern
 - Treatment failure
 - Loss of antimicrobial susceptibility
(e.g. artemisinin-resistant malaria)
- **Trade** in pharmaceuticals
 - Domestic pharmaceutical industry
