## **Narrative Report**

#### Area of Excellence: Investigation

I am a health disparities and health equity researcher committed to documenting and quantifying disparities, understanding the multi-level forces that contribute to them, and developing intervention and implementation strategies to achieve health equity.

My long-standing interest in advancing health equity through evidence-based research began during my medical training, where I contributed to a handbook on culturally sensitive care for migrants and other vulnerable populations. As a Master of Public Health Candidate at Johns Hopkins, I worked on a quality improvement project identifying gaps in service provision and health communication, which informed strategies to reduce adverse birth outcomes in the Baltimore area.

During my post-doctoral training at the Harvard Chan School and Harvard Medical School, I focused on disparities in chronic debilitating diseases among minoritized populations using a mixed-methods approach. I employed quantitative methods to document existing health disparities and qualitative methods to explore health behaviors and factors influencing these disparities. Using data from large, longitudinal cohorts, I led a project that quantified sexual orientation-related cancer disparities and found that lesbian women were disproportionally burdened by cancer. This work, published in *Cancer*, has important implications for data collection infrastructure and informs potential changes in medical practices and health care policies. I have also conducted other investigations using population-based data to evaluate prostate cancer screening behaviors and skin cancer risk factors by sexual orientation and gender identity.

For my qualitative work, I published a first-author study in the *Journal of Health Care for the Poor and Underserved* examining how multi-level vulnerabilities uniquely influence health service utilization and care access among vulnerabilized sexual minoritized women. Additionally, I have also contributed to multiple systematic scoping reviews and original investigations using mixed-methods approach. Beyond these publications, I have led a first-author protocol (published in November 2023), a first-author systematic scoping review (under review) and collaborated on a wide array of projects documenting health disparities in mental health, pregnancy outcomes, HIV/AIDS, cancer, cardiovascular health, and policy-level interventions.

As an early career researcher, I have conducted or collaborated on more than twenty research projects, resulting in ten publications, four manuscripts under review, and eight in progress. My work has been

selected for poster and oral presentations at regional and national levels, including at the NIH/NCI's national Symposium on Cancer Health Disparities and Dana Farber's Early Career Investigator Symposium. I was also part of the inaugural class of a national training program for sexual and gender minority cancer researchers and received awards from the Zhu Family Center for Cancer Prevention and the Open Gates Foundation to support my scholarship.

My research spans various vulnerabilized populations, including sexual and gender minoritized populations, undomiciled populations, and those who sell sex or use drugs; across different disorders, age groups, race/ethnicity, and socioeconomic strata. Despite the breadth of my interests, my work consistently focuses on documenting health disparities among vulnerable, minoritized populations and finding evidence-based solutions to close these gaps.

In the next phase of my career, I have joined the Mongan Institute at Massachusetts General Hospital as an Instructor of Investigation to broaden the scope of my health equity work. In this position, I will pivot my focus to developing and implementing evidence-based clinical interventions to address the disparities identified in formative research. Specifically, I will be leading sub-projects on two large, PCORI-funded studies: one focusing on agile health care delivery in a rapidly changing world and the other comparing two different system-level interventions to prevent burnout in ethnically diverse frontline providers in residential care facilities.

During my tenure as an Instructor of Investigation at the Mongan Institute, I also plan to leverage my prior training and research skills to apply for grants to support my career development, expand my expertise in health equity research, and further my scholarship in this field.

## **Teaching and Institutional Service**

Over the past few years, I have had the opportunity to teach multiple graduate-level courses. My teaching roles have included co-directing an independent study for PhD, MPH, and MD students at the Harvard Chan School. Additionally, I have taught clinical epidemiology and population health at Harvard Medical School and served as a faculty facilitator for LGBTQ+ patient encounters, ensuring that medical students are well-prepared to provide inclusive and sensitive care. Beyond these formal teaching roles, I have frequently been invited as a guest lecturer in various courses on topical health areas at the Harvard Chan School. I have also taken on informal teaching and mentoring responsibilities, assisting students with specific research papers and projects.

In my new role as an Instructor at the Mongan Institute and Massachusetts General Hospital, I am excited to continue my commitment to teaching and institutional service. I will be contributing to the institute's Health Equity Data & Delivery Science Certificate Program as a faculty facilitator and educator, equipping physicians with the knowledge and skills necessary to conduct health disparities research. Additionally, I will be supporting the research education and training core of a newly funded cross-institutional project (Mass EQLHS) that aims to advance equity-focused learning health systems through innovative research and education initiatives.

<u>Summary</u>: The overarching goal of my academic career is centered on pioneering impactful research to promote health equity for all. As I advance towards becoming an independent physician-scientist, this commitment will continue to transpire through rigorous scholarship, expanding network of collaboration, and education of peers in the medical and research communities.
